A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Neighbors,

It has been a wonderful and busy summer in our community. At times, it seemed like half the city was under construction (actually, I think it was!). The amount of money spent on the annual street program was increased by over \$200,000 to \$500,000. The \$2.4 million reconstruction of Goodale Boulevard, west of Grandview Avenue, is scheduled to be completed by the end of September. It includes new storm and sanitary sewers through most of the area. There will be bike paths along the street, a new tennis plaza, additional sidewalks and a multi-purpose path. As mentioned before, this project was funded by a combination grant/loan from the Ohio Public Works Commission.

Work continues on the street framework and new buildings in the Grandview Yard. On June 27th, Nationwide Insurance announced that it will be moving over 3,000 jobs to the Grandview Yard over the next five years. The agreement between Nationwide Reality Investors and the city will accelerate the pace of development in the Yard. You will see a lot of work starting this fall on the streets and building sites to make way for the new 500,000 square foot Nationwide corporate campus, an additional hotel, and a 13,000 square foot conference center. The plan also includes a 2.5 acre park that will serve as a community event and gathering place, important amenities for the community. The Yard project is very consistent with the 2004 Community Plan that this city developed with public input, and will meet the city's fiscal goals.

Thank you for attending the ribbon-cutting for the Pierce Park renovation, held after the Memorial Day parade. There has been a great deal of positive feedback to us by the community. The Wyman Woods renovation continues on schedule with a projected ribbon cutting around mid-October, the same month the park was dedicated sixty years ago. The ceremony will include the dedication of the shelter as the WW Williams Shelter honoring the company for its \$100,000 dollar contribution toward the expansion and renovation of the shelter.

The commitment of NRI to build a second hotel at

the Grandview Yard will generate additional money for park improvements. By ordinance, 50% of the money generated by the bed tax is earmarked for the Parks and Recreation Capital Improvement Fund. This Fund has contributed to the improvements at Pierce Field and Wyman Woods. As the next park project the Park's Advisory Board has been asked to make recommendations on improving our community pool. In addition, preliminary work is continuing on the Memorial Park improvements and the installation of the soldier statue. The base will be made from Ohio limestone. We are still awaiting a final proof from the sculptor and may move the dedication to Memorial Day 2015. The project was possible because of a generous donation from Doctors Thomas and Lowell Williams.

In July, I accepted the resignation of Police Chief David Wood. Dave did a great job building morale and pride within the department and was active in the community. Fortunately, I was able to reach into the department and appoint Sergeant Tom McCann as the new Grandview Heights Chief of Police. Chief McCann is a very skilled and professional officer and has been part of our police department for over thirty years. He has over the years clearly earned the respect of his fellow officers as well as city officials and residents he has come into contact with over those years.

I continue to urge all residents to visit the city's website and to sign up to receive notices by logging in at <http://www.grandviewheights.org/notifyme>. This is the most effective way to receive information on matters that may impact your household or about upcoming public meetings and legislation. Nearly all of the various forms and applications of all departments are also available for downloading and printing.

I thank the community for its ongoing support over the years, and hope you take advantage of some of the great programs and events that are being offered by the Parks and Recreation Department this fall.

Grandview Avenue Farmers' Market began its 11th season in 2014. The market operates every Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., through October, in the parking lot of Vino Vino, Grandview Avenue and Third. The market is hosted by the Wagenbrenner Company, operated by Pearl Alley Growers', with support from Fifth by Northwest Commission.

The market offers farm fresh seasonal produce from apples to zucchini, directly from farm producers. Additional product available includes honey, fresh herbs, cut flowers, handmade herbal soaps, and homemade jams and jellies. Food items at the market vary each year, but will include specialty baked goods from LuLu's, fresh kettle corn and homemade soups from The Lucky Ladle.

The market offers opportunities for area restaurants to showcase their offerings using the farmers' fresh produce. Many

area businesses take advantage of guest vendor times to bring their wares to market, and non-profit groups participate, including the Grandview Swim Team's yearly mum sale.

Don't Fall Back— Help Protect Our Local Water Resources!

Fall is a beautiful time of year, as the summer heat gives way to cooling temperatures and falling leaves. Neighborhood activities seem to change with the seasons as people begin to spend more time in cleanup mode. Rakes and trash bags abound to deal with the change of season. With this change in weather, we must remember to be conscientious of the impact of our activities on our water resources. Rainy weather washes accumulated pollutants from your property down the storm drains, directly to our streams and rivers, resulting in water contamination and blockages which may lead to flooding.

The following items should not be dumped into storm drains:

- Grass clippings and yard waste
- Car wash soaps

- Household and automobile hazardous waste, including paint, oil, batteries or other toxic materials
- Pet waste
- Chlorinated pool or spa water
- Litter

Some simple ways to make sure you are doing your part to reduce stormwater pollution is to sweep up yard debris and pile it on your yard for pickup, rather than hosing it down the drain. Compost or recycle yard waste when possible. Take your car to a car wash where the dirty soaps are disposed of into the sanitary sewer system. Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly and when their use is necessary, use chemicals in recommended amounts and not in areas adjacent to streams or rivers. Also avoid such application

when the weather calls for rain. Dispose of pet waste by flushing it down the toilet or sealed within your solid waste container. To learn more about where to properly dispose of household hazardous waste like paints, solvents, and batteries, contact the **Solid Waste Authority of Central Ohio (SWACO)** at **614-871-5100**.

Remember—everything washed or thrown into a storm drain flows directly to our streams and rivers.

Help protect our local water resources. Ensure that only stormwater is entering our storm system, and become part of the stormwater pollution solution in your neighborhood!

Memorial Park Statue Update and Paver Sale

As a result of a generous donation made by Grandview residents Thomas and Lowell Williams, Grandview Heights can look forward to a new statue to grace Memorial Park in the coming months.

The statue, depicting a WWII soldier who is honoring a fallen fellow soldier, is in the final stages of design work. A base for the statue and additional improvements to the immediate area of the statue, which will be located in the central plaza of the park on the Northwest Boulevard side of the flagpole, have already been designed. The statue's base will also support the seasonal memorial wreath. The concrete plaza area will increase in size to accommodate the statue and its base and still allow for room for people to walk around and observe the statue.

We hope to have the statue in time for a Veteran's Day unveiling, but should there be delays in design or construction, a Memorial Day weekend 2015 dedication will be planned.

Pavers are being sold for \$30 to be installed in a space in front of the statue to recognize the men and women who have served our country in the military. Proceeds from the paver sale will be used to purchase and maintain this paver display. Pavers may be purchased by and for active duty and former military members that have lived or worked in the Tri-Village area. Street Tree Sale

Recyclable materials may be placed in a reusable, 32 gallon container (50

pounds maximum), display a **Recycle Grandview** sticker (sticker obtained at 1525 Goodale Blvd.) and placed next to alley, or if no alley exists, on the tree lawn curb strip for collection. Tied plastic trash bags may also be used. Mark “Recycle” on bag.

Yard Waste

Organic material only, NO plastics.

From April through November, yard waste, if properly bundled or packaged, will be picked up on Monday for all Grandview Heights and Marble Cliff residents. Yard waste shall not be set out earlier than one (1) hour prior to sunset on Sunday. Unless otherwise indicated, bundles or bags of yard waste shall be placed next to the alley or if no alley exists, behind curb at the street.

Tree limbs and shrubbery must be cut and bundled with biodegradable twine or string (no wire, plastics or nylon string). Bundles should be no larger than 2 feet in diameter, 4 feet long and weighing no more than 50 pounds per bundle.

All **storm damage** must be treated the same as yard waste unless it came from a public tree. All private brush which falls on city right-of-way will be cleared by city crews either by returning the debris to the property of origin or by chipping if it would be more efficient.

Grass, leaves and plant materials must be placed in biodegradable paper or other paper bags, not to exceed 30 gallon capacity (plastic or biodegradable plastic are not permitted).

Neither dirt-covered roots nor soil will be accepted.

Residents may use a refuse container for yard waste. The containers **must** display a "Yard Waste" sticker (obtained by calling 488-4728), weigh no more than 50 pounds when full, and should not have limbs stick out more than 12" above the top of the container.

From December through March, yard waste may be dropped off at the Service Department between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. weekdays.

Garbage and Refuse Containers

All resident are required to provide their own containers. Containers shall:

- a. Be constructed of galvanized metal

or low temperature heavy duty plastic (no oil, grease, or other drums are permitted), shall have a least two handles for lifting, and shall be fitted with tight lids with handles. These containers shall be maintained in good condition and shall be kept clean. Rusted, broken, leaky, unsanitary containers or containers without lids, and/or handles may be marked with a condemned sticker and disposed of by the collector on the next regular collection day.

- b. Be properly sealed disposable plastic bags of not less than 3 mils thickness if placed not earlier than one (1) hour prior to sunset the day before collection day.
- c. Have a capacity of not less than ten (10) gallons and **not more than thirty-two (32) gallons.**
- d. Be sure that bags and cans are manageable and **do not exceed 50 lbs.**
- e. Lids are required, to keep trash dry. Wet trash is heavy and causes injury to our workers.

2014 Leaf Pick-Up Schedule

The City of Grandview Heights will start regular pick-up the week of October 20, 2014 ending approximately December 5, 2014 (weather permitting) with two routes. A crew will start at Lincoln Road and work its way east to Grandview Avenue. The second crew will start at Grandview Avenue and work east to the corporation line.

Please rake leaves to the tree lawn curb area next to the street. Do not rake leaves into the street as the leaves may block the storm sewers or may start a fire when a car is parked on top of them.

Leaves may also be bagged and left at your normal pick-up area for Monday yard waste pick-up through the end of November. If you bag, please use the large bodegradable lawn and leaf bags.

Please note that no regular yard waste should be intermingled with the leaves. Thank you.

E-Waste Collection

The City of Grandview Heights and Goodwill Columbus will sponsor an e-waste collection drive on October 4, 2014 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at 1525 Goodale Boulevard. Visit our website at www.grandviewheights.org for more information.

If you are elderly and/or physically disabled, please contact the Department of Service at 488-4728 to make special arrangements for solid waste pickup.

2014 Street Sweeping

Weather permitting, street sweeping is tentatively scheduled for early Spring. The exact dates will be advertised in the Tri-Village and This Week in Grandview newspapers.

Your compliance with the "no parking" signs for street sweeping is critical to enable the City to remove debris from the gutters and streets, which, if allowed to accumulate, contributes to localized flooding.

Hazardous Household Materials

For disposal of paint, and other hazardous household materials not listed above, please contact the Solid Waste Authority (SWACO) at 871-5100 for a schedule of drop-off locations. S.W.A.C.O. will not accept: appliances, tires, trash, propane tanks (over 20 lbs.) asbestos, needles, medical waste, used oil, car batteries, household cleaners and latex paint. Latex paint, when dried, is not considered hazardous and can be disposed in your bagged and tied trash. If the latex paint is not dried, stabilize it with kitty litter or sawdust before disposing of in the trash. Visit www.swaco.org for more information.


